OVERVIEW OF THE POSITION

To manage and oversee all activities of the assigned athletic or extra-curricular team.

RESPONSIBILITIES/DUTIES

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

1. Possesses knowledge of District policies and regulations relating to areas of responsibilities.
2. Maintains proper certification and training, including First Aid, CPR-AED, Bloodborne Pathogens and the like. High School coaches are required to complete ASEP/NIAAA-CEP certification.
3. Demonstrates and models leadership, sportsmanship and citizenship in all aspects of working with students and the school community.
4. Maintains knowledge of specific sport.
5. Demonstrates a commitment to keeping current in the sport that is being coached and an appreciation for how to teach the skills it requires.
6. Supervises and works cooperatively with parents and other team volunteers/ assistants.
7. Assumes responsibility for determining player and team eligibility.
8. Submits required reports to the District Office and/or building principals in a timely manner.
9. Facilitates effective communication between parents, athletes, and school administration and serves as the initial point of contact for parents regarding athletic matters and concerns.
10. Supervises and manages equipment, facilities and supplies.
11. Arranges for the availability of equipment necessary for the administration of contests.
12. Works with the Athletic Director to secure/ensure officials for all contests, games and/or meets.
13. Works with the Athletic Director in scheduling school athletic facilities.
14. Assists the custodians and maintenance personnel in coordinating maintenance programs for facilities.
15. Refers information to principals promptly regarding incidents or conduct that could result in disciplinary action.
16. Coordinates with physical education personnel on matters of sharing facilities, resources, and equipment.
17. Works with the Athletic Director to arrange for the supervision of home athletic events.
18. Works cooperatively with students, parents, staff and community members to project a positive, service-oriented demeanor.

ADDITIONAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

1. Coordinates and manages athletic awards for the school.
2. Makes the necessary arrangements for transporting athletic teams.
3. Represents the school at meetings or conferences relating to athletics.
4. Arranges for preparation of fields for contests.
5. Coordinates clinics, professional improvement programs and pre- and post- season coaches' meetings.
6. Coordinates special athletic/activity events, as needed.
7. Attend Board or other meetings as requested.
8. Performs other duties as assigned.

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The Riverdale School District serves over 600 families living in a residential, wooded area seven miles south of downtown Portland, Oregon and adjacent to the city of Lake Oswego. The grade school is the only public facility in the neighborhood and is a focal point for community activity. Lewis and Clark College is located within the District. The Portland metropolitan area, with a population of 1.2 million, is the cultural and economic center for Oregon. Residents enjoy the benefits of a major urban area, while living within a short drive of both the Cascade Mountains and the Pacific Ocean. The Riverdale Community has valued excellence in education for more than 100 years. Riverdale's centennial celebration in the spring of 1988 drew more than 750 alumni. The community prides itself on its independent status and voted to retain this independence with the passage of a bond in March 1996 to build a high school. Riverdale School District has always enjoyed widespread community interest, involvement and support.

Riverdale Grade School offers a program for students in kindergarten through grade eight and provides a comprehensive and varied curriculum. The kindergarten through grade eight students benefit from a low student-teacher ratio, with two classes per grade and approximately 360 total students. The grade school is organized as Primary (K-3), Intermediate (4-5-6) and Upper Grades (7-8) to allow for broad curriculum flexibility. The faculty includes specialists in music, second languages, physical education, library/media, art and special education/student services. Students also enjoy a diverse selection of enrichment programs. A Field Studies program involving students and staff combines learning experiences with the opportunity to explore Oregon's many resources. Both Riverdale Grade School and Riverdale High School have state of the art computer labs with computers networked throughout the schools and connected to the Internet.

Riverdale High School opened in September 1996 for grades 9-12 and spent the first six years in temporary locations (the first year in Portland and next five years at Maryhurst University in Lake Oswego). The high school is now in its permanent location at 9727 SW Terwilliger Boulevard in Portland—just two miles from the Riverdale Grade School. The building was dedicated with a wonderful grand opening celebration on September 3, 2003. Riverdale School District has over 100 high school age students who currently have the choice of attending either Riverdale High School or a neighboring high school with a reciprocal agreement for transferring students. It is anticipated that Riverdale High School will grow to a maximum size of 320 students in its new facility while maintaining a low student-teacher ratio to maximize individual attention. In addition to resident students, non-resident students are encouraged to attend Riverdale High School on a tuition or inter-district transfer basis.

Riverdale High School has a college preparatory focus. The yearly schedule includes three terms; the daily schedule includes five 70-minute periods. Each term provides .5 credit for each class, with core courses taken for two terms each year. Courses are personally and academically challenging and honors distinction is available for those students who undertake extra work. For students who have already mastered certain subject areas, individual curriculum options may be arranged. All students exceed the state graduation requirements by completing 28 credits.

A wide range of activities is offered as part of a well-rounded high school experience. Riverdale currently fields teams in football, soccer, volleyball, basketball, track, lacrosse, tennis and golf and as is a member of 3A - OSAA. Over 70% of the student body participates in inter-scholastic sports. Over 35% participate in drama, band and choir. The students also put on a musical production every spring. Teams representing Riverdale have performed well at the regional Science bowl and Mock Trial events. A key advantage of Riverdale High is that those who want to participate have the opportunity to do so.

Riverdale schools focus first and foremost on the relationship between teacher and student, and the academic disciplines that bring them together. Students are required to demonstrate their understanding of a core subject matter through classroom work as well as demonstrations called "exhibitions." These exhibitions provide a basis for accountability by asking students to show what they know. The focus of the high school is to help adolescents learn to use their minds well. Riverdale School District is committed to providing education for all students that is personalized, learner-centered, and academically "rigorous."
